

3. Meeks felt the plat provided by Zickwolf did not depict the boundaries she had been shown in the field, and felt that errors by Zickwolf resulted in the encroachment, leading her to bring the complaint.

4. Zickwolf provided evidence that he had surveyed in accordance with the Minimum Standards for Boundary Surveys in Arkansas.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Upon review of the evidence in its possession, the Board finds the conduct by Zickwolf described in the Findings of Fact does not warrant further investigation or other action.

ORDER

Based on these findings, the complaint against Zickwolf is dismissed.


